So I've just finished reading Maggie by Mya O'Malley and I fell in love with this seat gripping, suspenseful book. That made a change as normally I find I can guess where the book is heading, but there really was no chance of that with Maggie. The author attempted to present two voices through most of this book. The problem is that the two were indistinguishable. Add to that very poor character development, pacing, what should have been a magnificent plot was not. There was a win at the end though. I sobbed through it, surprised as I tissue away tears as fast as possible and still wound up with a damp pillowcase. So, while not a great work and indeed, would benefit from much more editing and re-writes, especially in the beginning to the middle, not entirely without recommendation either.

Maggie by Mya Oâ™Malley is a another four star book. Mya has the ability to make you believe in the paranormal even if you have never believed in it before. I don't understand how she does it, but the unbelievable suddenly becomes all consuming and believable. Naomi is a writer. She has just bought herself a house. Worse than the couple of times he physically abused her, was his emotional abuse. How can an attractive, smart woman get herself into this situation? How did she let herself get into this situation? As she goes to the blind date, her date rubs her the wrong way. He was late, he is haughty, he is unlikeable. She needs a break from him. Off she heads to the bar to get herself a drink. As she walks up, she sees a very handsome man and decides she is going to have what he is having. They end up talking for hours and have dinner at the restaurant. Their

relationship blossoms and Naomi thinks Ryan might be the one. As their relationship grows, they decide to start researching one of the woman who lays in the graveyard. Naomi starts writing her version of Maggie's suspicious story as she is having dreams about what actually happened to her. The police tell her to leave it alone.
